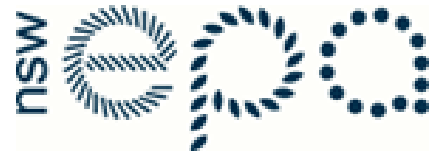

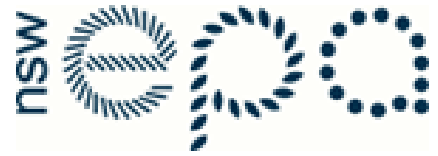

Information about this licence

Dictionary

A definition of terms used in the licence can be found in the dictionary at the end of this licence.

Responsibilities of licensee

Separate to the requirements of this licence, general obligations of licensees are set out in the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 ("the Act") and the Regulations made under the Act. These include obligations to:

- ensure persons associated with you comply with this licence, as set out in section 64 of the Act;
- control the pollution of waters and the pollution of air (see for example sections 120 - 132 of the Act);
- report incidents causing or threatening material environmental harm to the environment, as set out in Part 5.7 of the Act.

Variation of licence conditions

The licence holder can apply to vary the conditions of this licence. An application form for this purpose is available from the EPA.

The EPA may also vary the conditions of the licence at any time by written notice without an application being made.

Where a licence has been granted in relation to development which was assessed under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 in accordance with the procedures applying to integrated development, the EPA may not impose conditions which are inconsistent with the development consent conditions until the licence is first reviewed under Part 3.6 of the Act.

Duration of licence

This licence will remain in force until the licence is surrendered by the licence holder or until it is suspended or revoked by the EPA or the Minister. A licence may only be surrendered with the written approval of the EPA.

Licence review

The Act requires that the EPA review your licence at least every 5 years after the issue of the licence, as set out in Part 3.6 and Schedule 5 of the Act. You will receive advance notice of the licence review.

Fees and information to be sent to the EPA

For each licence fee period you must pay:

- an administrative fee; and
- a load-based fee (if applicable).

Usually, the licence fee period is the same as the reporting period.

The EPA publication “A Guide to Licensing” contains information about how to calculate your licence fees.

A licence subject to load-based licensing (LBL) requires an Annual Return to be submitted to the EPA, comprising a Statement of Compliance for Load Based Fee Calculation for each assessable pollutant required by the licence. The Annual Return must be submitted by the “due date”, as defined in the dictionary at the end of the licence. Refer to the Annual Return reporting requirements under Section 6 “Reporting Conditions”.

Transfer of licence

The licence holder can apply to transfer the licence to another person. An application form for this purpose is available from the EPA.

Public register and access to monitoring data

Part 9.5 of the Act requires the EPA to keep a public register of details and decisions of the EPA in relation to, for example:

- licence applications;
- licence conditions and variations;
- statements of compliance;
- load based licensing information; and
- load reduction agreements.

Under s320 of the Act application can be made to the EPA for access to monitoring data which has been submitted to the EPA by licensees.

1 Administrative Conditions

A1 What the licence authorises and regulates

A1.1 No scheduled activities are to be undertaken at the premises identified in A2 until scheduled development works are completed to the satisfaction of the EPA and the EPA has varied the licence to remove this condition.

A1.2 Prior to the commencement of scheduled activities at the premises identified in A2, the Licensee must submit a licence variation application to the EPA. The application must include the following information and documents:

- Confirmation that a meteorological station is operating on site in accordance with the requirements of Condition B23 of Development Consent SSD-11591659.
- A copy of a Water Management Plan prepared and approved in accordance with the requirements of Condition B32 of Development Consent SSD-11591659.

The licence variation application must be approved by the EPA prior to the commencement of scheduled activities at the premises identified in A2.

A1.3 This licence authorises the carrying out of the scheduled development work listed below at the premises listed in A2:

This licence does not currently permit operation of the scheduled activity: Extractive Activities. A licence variation will be required prior to commencement of Extractive Activities at the Premises listed in A2..

A1.4 Notwithstanding A1.1, the scale of the land-based extractive activity authorised under this licence must not exceed \$Parameter1\$ tonnes per annum, being the amount equivalent to the extraction limit approved by the development consent granted under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* for the premises specified in A2.

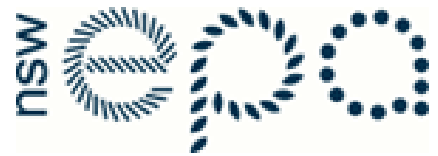

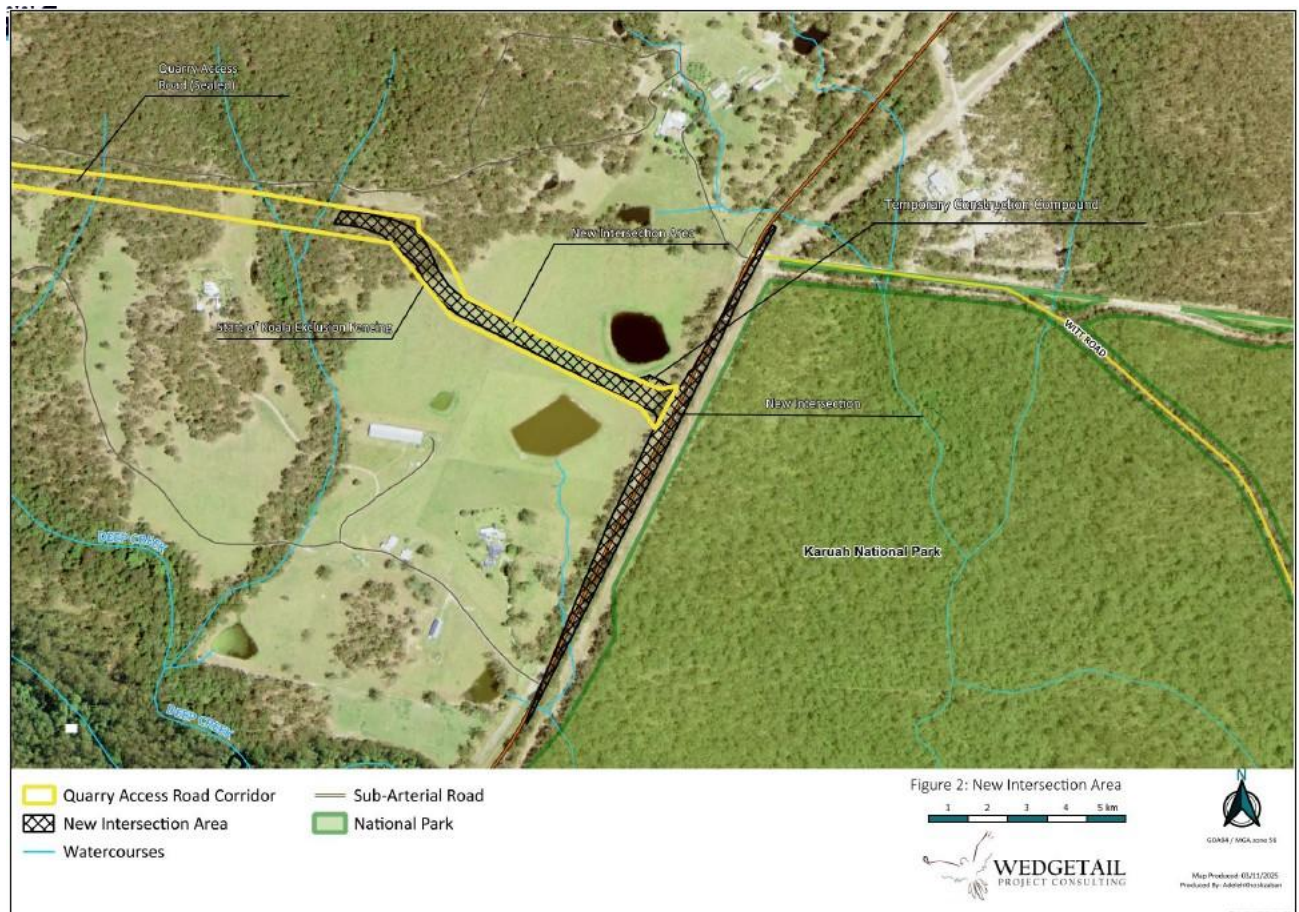


Figure 2: Area subject to this Construction Environmental Management Plan

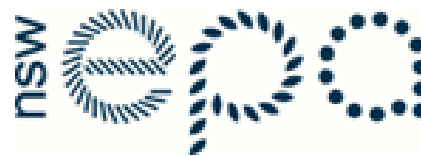

A3 Other activities

A3.1 This licence applies to all other activities carried on at the premises, including:

Scheduled development works



A4 Information supplied to the EPA

A4.1 Works and activities must be carried out in accordance with the proposal contained in the licence application, except as expressly provided by a condition of this licence.

In this condition the reference to "the licence application" includes a reference to:

- a) the applications for any licences (including former pollution control approvals) which this licence replaces under the Protection of the Environment Operations (Savings and Transitional) Regulation 1998; and
- b) the licence information form provided by the licensee to the EPA to assist the EPA in connection with the issuing of this licence.

2 Discharges to Air and Water and Applications to Land

P1 Location of monitoring/discharge points and areas

P1.1 The following points referred to in the table below are identified in this licence for the purposes of weather and/or noise monitoring and/or setting limits for the emission of noise from the premises.

3 Limit Conditions

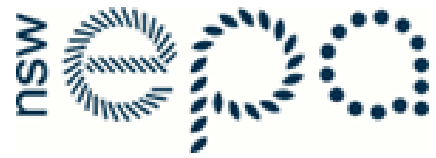
L1 Pollution of waters

L1.1 Except as may be expressly provided in any other condition of this licence, the licensee must comply with section 120 of the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997.

L2 Hours of operation

L2.1 Construction work at the premises must only be conducted on:

- Monday to Friday between 7:00am to 5:00pm
- Saturday between 8:00am to 1:00pm; and
- at no time on Sundays and Public Holidays.

L3 Potentially offensive odour

- L3.1** The licensee must not cause or permit the emission of offensive odour beyond the boundary of the premises.
- L3.2** No condition of this licence identifies a potentially offensive odour for the purposes of section 129 of the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997.

4 Operating Conditions

O1 Activities must be carried out in a competent manner

- O1.1** Licensed activities must be carried out in a competent manner.
This includes:
- a) the processing, handling, movement and storage of materials and substances used to carry out the activity; and
 - b) the treatment, storage, processing, reprocessing, transport and disposal of waste generated by the activity.

O2 Maintenance of plant and equipment

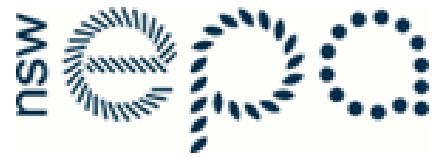
- O2.1** All plant and equipment installed at the premises or used in connection with the licensed activity:
- a) must be maintained in a proper and efficient condition; and
 - b) must be operated in a proper and efficient manner.

O3 Dust

- O3.1** Activities occurring in or on the premises must be carried out in a manner that will minimise the generation, or emission from the premises, of wind-blown or traffic generated dust.
- O3.2** The premises must be maintained in a condition which minimises or prevents the emission of dust from the premises.

O4 Emergency response

- O4.1** The licensee must maintain, and implement as necessary, a current emergency response plan for the premises. The licensee must keep the emergency response plan on the premises at all times. The emergency response plan must document systems and procedures to deal with all types of incidents (e.g. spills, explosions or fire) that may occur at the premises or that may be associated with activities that occur at the premises and which are likely to cause harm to the environment. If a current emergency response plan does not exist at the date on which this condition is attached to the licence, the licensee must develop an emergency response plan within three months of that date.



O5 Processes and management

- O5.1** All works must be carried out in accordance with the document titled "Construction Environmental Management Plan - Stage 1 - New Intersection Area" Wedgetail Project Consulting Pty Ltd dated 31.03.26 and "Deep Creek Quarry - Noise, Blast and Vibration Management Plan" Todoroski Air Sciences 20.07.26 to minimise the emission of noise and vibration from the premises.
- O5.2** The licensee must maximise the diversion of run-on waters from lands upslope and around the site whilst land disturbance activities are being undertaken.
- O5.3** The licensee must maximise the diversion of stormwater runoff containing suspended solids to sediment basins installed on the premises.
- O5.4** The drainage from all areas that will mobilise suspended solids when stormwater runs over these areas must be controlled and diverted through appropriate erosion and sediment control measures.
- O5.5** The licensee must minimise the area of the site that is able to generate suspended material when water runs over it.
- O5.6** The licensee must inspect all erosion and sediment control measures:
 - a) At least daily when rain is occurring
 - b) At least weekly (even if work is not occurring on-site)
 - c) Within 24 hours prior to expected rainfall; and
 - d) Within 18 hours of a rainfall event of sufficient intensity and duration to cause on-site runoff.

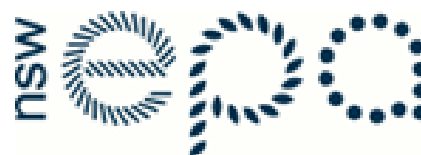
5 Monitoring and Recording Conditions

M1 Monitoring records

- M1.1** The results of any monitoring required to be conducted by this licence or a load calculation protocol must be recorded and retained as set out in this condition.
- M1.2** All records required to be kept by this licence must be:
 - a) in a legible form, or in a form that can readily be reduced to a legible form;
 - b) kept for at least 4 years after the monitoring or event to which they relate took place; and
 - c) produced in a legible form to any authorised officer of the EPA who asks to see them.
- M1.3** The following records must be kept in respect of any samples required to be collected for the purposes of this licence:
 - a) the date(s) on which the sample was taken;
 - b) the time(s) at which the sample was collected;
 - c) the EPA point identification number for the point at which the sample was taken; and
 - d) the name of the person who collected the sample

M2 Weather monitoring

- M2.1** At the point(s) identified below, the licensee must monitor (by sampling and obtaining results by analysis) the parameters specified in Column 1 of the table below, using the corresponding

sampling method, units of measure, averaging period and sampling frequency, specified opposite in the Columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 respectively.

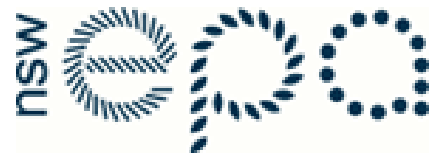

M3 Recording of pollution complaints

- M3.1** The licensee must keep a legible record of all complaints made to the licensee or any employee or agent of the licensee in relation to pollution arising from any activity to which this licence applies.
- M3.2** The record must include details of the following:
- a) the date and time of the complaint;
 - b) the method by which the complaint was made;
 - c) any personal details of the complainant which were provided by the complainant or, if no such details were provided, a note to that effect;
 - d) the nature of the complaint;
 - e) the action taken by the licensee in relation to the complaint, including any follow-up contact with the complainant; and
 - f) if no action was taken by the licensee, the reasons why no action was taken.
- M3.3** The record of a complaint must be kept for at least 4 years after the complaint was made.
- M3.4** The record must be produced to any authorised officer of the EPA who asks to see them.

M4 Telephone complaints line

- M4.1** The licensee must operate during its operating hours a telephone complaints line for the purpose of receiving any complaints from members of the public in relation to activities conducted at the premises or by the vehicle or mobile plant, unless otherwise specified in the licence.



- M4.2** The licensee must notify the public of the complaints line telephone number and the fact that it is a complaints line so that the impacted community knows how to make a complaint.
- M4.3** The preceding two conditions do not apply until 1 month the date of the issue of this licence.

6 Reporting Conditions

R1 Compliance, and annual reporting requirements

Compliance with licence conditions

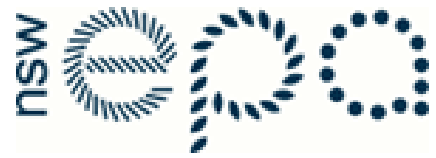
- R1.1** The licensee must supply the EPA, via the EPA's online digital portal, the following details of any non-compliance with the conditions of the licence within 21 days after the licensee becomes aware of the non-compliance:
- a. the date the licensee became aware of the non-compliance;
 - b. the date(s) the non-compliance occurred, including if the non-compliance is continuing;
 - c. whether the non-compliance relates to air, water/land, noise or waste matters (if applicable);
 - d. whether the non-compliance relates to a pollution incident;
 - e. the licence condition(s) not complied with;
 - f. a summary of particulars of the non-compliance, including (if known):
 - i. the location where the non-compliance occurred;
 - ii. the duration of the non-compliance;
 - iii. if the non-compliance is continuing, the suspected end date of the non-compliance;
 - g. the cause or suspected cause of the non-compliance;
 - h. any action taken, or proposed to be taken, to mitigate the effects of the non-compliance; and
 - i. any action taken, or proposed to be taken, to prevent a recurrence of the non-compliance.
- R1.2** The EPA may make a written request for further details in relation to each non-compliance reported in accordance with Condition R1.1. The licensee must provide such further details to the EPA, via the EPA's online digital portal, within the time specified in the request.
- R1.3** Condition R1.1 does not apply where a non-compliance with a licence condition has been identified by the EPA as part of an EPA environmental compliance audit.

Reporting transition arrangements

Pollution monitoring data summary

- R1.4** If the licensee undertakes monitoring as a result of a licence condition, the licensee must supply to the EPA a summary of the results of the pollution monitoring data in respect of each reporting period. The summary must be provided as a Microsoft Excel file, formatted with the following column headings:
- a. EPA point identification number;
 - b. pollutant;
 - c. unit of measure;
 - d. number of samples required;
 - e. number of samples collected and analysed;

- f. lowest sample value;
- g. mean of sample values; and
- h. highest sample value.

The pollution monitoring data summary for the reporting period must be supplied to the EPA via the EPA's online digital portal by the "due date", as defined in the dictionary at the end of this licence.

R2 Reporting documents

R2.1 The licensee must complete and supply to the EPA an Annual Return in the approved form comprising:

- 1. a Statement of Compliance,
- 2. a Monitoring and Complaints Summary,
- 3. a Statement of Compliance - Licence Conditions,
- 4. a Statement of Compliance - Load based Fee,
- 5. a Statement of Compliance - Requirement to Prepare Pollution Incident Response Management Plan,
- 6. a Statement of Compliance - Requirement to Publish Pollution Monitoring Data; and
- 7. a Statement of Compliance - Environmental Management Systems and Practices.

At the end of each reporting period, the EPA will provide to the licensee notification that the Annual Return is due.

R2.2 An Annual Return must be prepared in respect of each reporting period, except as provided below.

R2.3 Where this licence is transferred from the licensee to a new licensee:

- a) the transferring licensee must prepare an Annual Return for the period commencing on the first day of the reporting period and ending on the date the application for the transfer of the licence to the new licensee is granted; and
- b) the new licensee must prepare an Annual Return for the period commencing on the date the application for the transfer of the licence is granted and ending on the last day of the reporting period.

R2.4 Where this licence is surrendered by the licensee or revoked by the EPA or Minister, the licensee must prepare an Annual Return in respect of the period commencing on the first day of the reporting period and ending on:

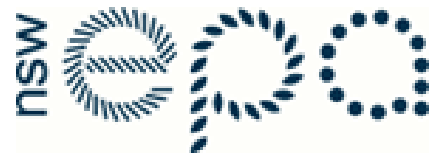
- a) in relation to the surrender of a licence - the date when notice in writing of approval of the surrender is given; or
- b) in relation to the revocation of the licence - the date from which notice revoking the licence operates.

R2.5 The Annual Return for the reporting period must be supplied to the EPA via *eConnect EPA* or by registered post not later than 60 days after the end of each reporting period or in the case of a transferring licence not later than 60 days after the date the transfer was granted (the 'due date').

R2.6 The licensee must retain a copy of the Annual Return supplied to the EPA for a period of at least 4 years after the Annual Return was due to be supplied to the EPA.

R2.7 Within the Annual Return, the Statements of Compliance must be certified and the Monitoring and Complaints Summary must be signed by:

- a) the licence holder; or
- b) by a person approved in writing by the EPA to sign on behalf of the licence holder.

R3 Notification of environmental harm

- R3.1** Notifications must be made by telephoning the Environment Line service on 131 555.
- R3.2** The licensee must provide written details of the notification to the EPA within 7 days of the date on which they became aware of the incident.

R4 Written report

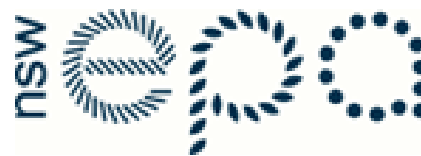
- R4.1** Where an authorised officer of the EPA suspects on reasonable grounds that:
 - a) where this licence applies to premises, an event has occurred at the premises; or
 - b) where this licence applies to vehicles or mobile plant, an event has occurred in connection with the carrying out of the activities authorised by this licence, and the event has caused, is causing or is likely to cause material harm to the environment (whether the harm occurs on or off premises to which the licence applies), the authorised officer may request a written report of the event.
- R4.2** The licensee must make all reasonable inquiries in relation to the event and supply the report to the EPA within such time as may be specified in the request.
- R4.3** The request may require a report which includes any or all of the following information:
 - a) the cause, time and duration of the event;
 - b) the type, volume and concentration of every pollutant discharged as a result of the event;
 - c) the name, address and business hours telephone number of employees or agents of the licensee, or a specified class of them, who witnessed the event;
 - d) the name, address and business hours telephone number of every other person (of whom the licensee is aware) who witnessed the event, unless the licensee has been unable to obtain that information after making reasonable effort;
 - e) action taken by the licensee in relation to the event, including any follow-up contact with any complainants;
 - f) details of any measure taken or proposed to be taken to prevent or mitigate against a recurrence of such an event; and
 - g) any other relevant matters.
- R4.4** The EPA may make a written request for further details in relation to any of the above matters if it is not satisfied with the report provided by the licensee. The licensee must provide such further details to the EPA within the time specified in the request.

7 General Conditions

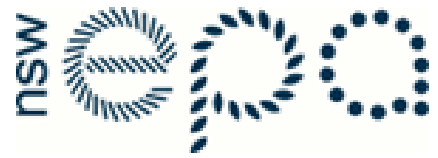
G1 Copy of licence kept at the premises or plant

- G1.1** A copy of this licence must be kept at the premises to which the licence applies.
- G1.2** The licence must be produced to any authorised officer of the EPA who asks to see it.

- G1.3** The licence must be available for inspection by any employee or agent of the licensee working at the premises.

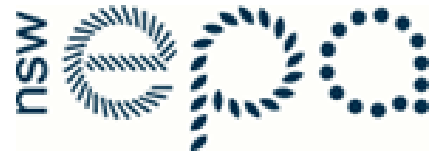

TSS	Means total suspended solids
Type 1 substance	Means the elements antimony, arsenic, cadmium, lead or mercury or any compound containing one or more of those elements
Type 2 substance	Means the elements beryllium, chromium, cobalt, manganese, nickel, selenium, tin or vanadium or any compound containing one or more of those elements
utilisation area	Means any area shown as a utilisation area on a map submitted with the application for this licence
waste	Has the same meaning as in the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997
waste type	Means liquid, restricted solid waste, general solid waste (putrescible), general solid waste (non - putrescible), special waste or hazardous waste
wellhead	Has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Protection of the Environment Operations (General) Regulation 2022
